

ABA DELEGATES

TLAW Member Carole Lynch Worthington is running for a seat as national Delegate-at-Large to the ABA House of Delegates. The election takes place at the upcoming ABA annual meeting in Hawaii. Carole has been extremely active in the ABA. She was the second Tennessean elected as President of the National Conference of Bar Presidents. Shep Tate of Memphis was the first. Carole has served on numerous commissions, committees of the House and Standing Committees of the ABA. A fellow of the American, Tennessee and Chattanooga Bar Foundations, Carole lectures on ethics annually at the University of Kentucky's National Conference on Equine Law. The ABA race features thirteen candidates for six positions. Those attending the ABA Annual Meeting will be able to vote in the election.

An important role for TLAW is promoting the election of women. Tasha Blakney of Knoxville holds the Young Lawyer's seat in the Tennessee delegation to the ABA House of Delegates, which has also been held by Cynthia Wyrick and Jackie Dixon. The only woman elected as a Tennessee Bar Association delegate, Cissy Daughtery, was defeated for re-election. Tennessee has never had a woman as State Delegate, who casts the vote of Tennessee for election of officers in the ABA.
